Regular Report of Matthew Dunlop the VP Student Advocacy 2016-17 Term

Reporting Period: Sunday May 1st – Wednesday June 29th 2016

I am extremely delighted to be presenting my first report to you all. For any terms you do not know I have an index at the end of this document that may be assistive and also always know I am more than open as well as willing to have a sit down chat about the work I am doing or such. As this report covers almost two months I attempted to key in important items but most likely will have missed some.

May Day

On May 1st I presented to a community group regarding student worker solidarity as well as an update on upcoming student issues. It was well received and extension of support was given for if we need it. I spoke to the upcoming contract negotiation, the fight for 15 with an emphasis on fairness, and the importance of recognizing that they are us years ago and we are them years from now.

CFS Executive Meeting


I attended the first CFS - Ontario Executive meetings from May 6th-8th. This is a training and introductory meeting that helps orientate the new board which I sit on. Some key notes to let you know of:

- They are opening a new campaign titled "Fight the Fees" (will be presented to you soon)
- To create or expand campaigns a motion should be submitted to an AGM. I will be holding workshops/brainstorming on what motions, if any, we want to submit as Local 49, as all motions are to go through my office before submission
- They spoke about the newly branded "free tuition" and the victory, as well as messaging surrounding it
- A key item this year is the funding formula review for university funding
- Bill 132 (An Act to amend various statutes with respect to sexual violence, sexual harassment, domestic violence and related matters) was passed on March 8th

Bail or Jail

On May 13th I, as well as a few others from the UWSA, participated in the "Bail or Jail" event hosted by Crime Stoppers. We represented for the UWSA and showed our connectedness to the community.





Mental Health Presentation

On May 18th I attended a presentation on the results of a survey for mental health put on by Dr. Beg. Some key points:

- The survey conducted in Fall 2015 had almost 3,000 responses, with 2,128 being students of which 1,558 undergrad
- Awareness training and stress management (self-care) stood out primarily as needed.

Interesting point I found: When asked "If you were working with a student whom you suspected was in distress or displaying worrisome behaviour, where would you refer them?" For both employees and students:

- less than ½ of those who answered the question provided referral information to appropriate resources
- the remainder didn't know or didn't respond

There will be more to come on this as the Advocacy Committee last term identified need to develop an action plan on this. I am currently in the research stage.

CFS Skills + Tips Manual

From May 27th to the 29th 15 brave souls from the UWSA went to the Skills Conference to lessen the learning curve and develop key skills as a board member. From this trip and looking to the betterment and future of these trips I have developed a "tips" manual for the future to use. This manual will be assistive and beneficial to the skills trips to come



Bike Summit

On May 30th I attended the day long Windsor-Essex Bike Summit to learn about cycling in Windsor and how we (the school and community) can work together to have a healthier bike culture. Many of the ideas presented and case studies from other cities bike shares will be used to lessen the learning curve for our own this Fall.

Women's Campus Safety Grant

I held two attempts at brainstorming and putting together a UWSA submission to the Women's Campus Safety grant on May 31st and June 3rd respectively. We had no outside involvement other than two board member and decided to not submit anything. I would like to give special thanks to Amber Shaheen for her willingness to facilitate the meeting with me. I hope to hold the sessions again in the Winter when the opportunity arises and would enjoy the boards involvement.

CFS Nationals

From June 4th to 8th I attended the CFS-SANGM. Some key points:

- A motion for a National Day of Action, the first time since 2012, was passed and will be held on November 2nd. Planning sessions will soon be held and more information will come in time. This will take a collaborative effort which I hope will springboard us into being an activism driven student union this term
- The Leap Manifesto was passed to be signed by CFS National
- A declaration for the basis of an international student voice was also passed to be signed, more will come about the effect of this in the coming months

Government Action Against Healthcare Cuts - Bus to Toronto May 9th

I assisted the Ontario Nurses' Association (ONA) on gathering individuals for a bus to Queens Park to show distaste and speak to the effects of the current cuts in healthcare.

Fight for \$15

I attended a provincial conference call on May 9th and also personally connected an Organizer about the work being done and what is currently happening in the Windsor area for this campaign. More to come in following months but if interested let me know and I will remember

Senate (May 13th June 10th) and Committees

I have now set all of our senators to committees for this term. I also attended meetings for both May and June. Some key points:

- A report regarding indigenous peoples and post secondary education was presented and had a collecting of recommendations have been set out. If you are deeply interested in indigenous affairs or work please connect with me and I can help guide you through the document. I am looking at developing an Indigenous Research and Action group this term
- The exam policy has significantly changed. The policy has been amalgamated into senate bylaw 51 (Academic Evaluations) and has changed from "exams" to "meaningful in-term evaluations" as well as such being within a 24-hour period instead of the pervious calendar day (one could have an exam a 4P.M., 7P.M and 8:30A.M. the next day before)

Collective Impact

On June 13th I attended a Collective Impact presentation held by Pathway to Potential which I derived some ideas and best practices for how our campus groups/organizing can work collectively with a shared vision to have the longest term impact

Nap Room

I am currently on the research stage and have already met once with Dr. Smith and a group of

individuals who want to lead the charge. I am attempting to set up a follow up meeting to make a more concreate action plan

Board Training

Together the Operations Committee developed a new training package and researched best practices as well as evaluated current learning/training models. I am very proud of the work done and truly


