7.1 Quebec Student Strike Stance

Motion friendly amendment – passed

on March 22 the students started the strike

On May 21st – Quebec government passed a law to prevent protesting, 1500 fine on people who were to protest – bill condemned by UN – 500 000 15% of Quebec population came out in protest of this bill. – currently the situation the government is refusing to lower because they will lose the election – The goal of this motion is to show some form of solidarity and support for these students, because if they lose we all lose because this teaches the government that they can keep raising as much as they want.

A lot of students stop going to school because they can't afford it. Do a referendum question that ask the student what they feel should happen, where the tuition freezes of if there is a set increase every year

Mohamad Almoya-board of governors made a 4% increase, most students did not know let alone protest. Our students are so disconnected from what's going on. Quebec culture has students are so active and are keeping their tuition down. We should take examples from this culture. – number one issue to students in tuition, yet as a student union we don't have a position on it.

Shawn Steven – for – friendly amendment – I agree on the general points, about students speaking up. – We should explain in the motion WHY we are doing this, as it is now there are no explanations (even though the presentation explained this very well)

Mohammad Akbar- the UWSA makes it clear what solidarity in terms of this motion entails, and what the UWSA's intention is in showing solidarity - second by Almoyad

Natalie – this seems unnecessary

Omar zghal- Show what we will do to show this solidarity

- 4 – 9- 0 – amendment fails

Scott lock – I don't think that we should show solidarity with the students in Quebec, they started peaceful, but they are not anymore. We should not do anything for or against without the students input. The culture in Quebec and Ontario are completely different.

Omar Zghal – against- does not like referendum – depending on how we word it, students are obviously going to be against the tuition increase

Mohammad Akbar- we will hold a referendum on tuition fees, the question always comes to counsel anyways, we will develop the wording, this motion is that we will hold the referendum, the wording will come later and counsel will decides at a later date. Talk to Scott's point – concerned about the 'tactics' posters made by anarchist, where there has been violence, it hasn't been by students, students have actually subdued violent protesters. Confused how this has to do with this referendum. The motion says we will support the students, the rest just says stuff that I am going to do

Scott – education on advocacy, this is part of your job we don't need to tell you how to do it. Quebec receives a lot of government money for school that is why their tuition is so low, not all students are doing violent protests, that is the image for these students as violent protesters. This image will stay with people, and could negatively affect us when we try to do something later. The Quebec government has done many things to make things better for students such as extending the semester so students can finish their classes.

Mohammad Almoja – if we show solidarity to the students, the unions are not advocating for violence. – We are showing solidarity with the unions, their response to the tuition strikes, not the anarchy.

Natalie – friendly amendment – add student unions – to make it more clear

Mo – make this change

Natalie – students need to become aware that not only is Quebec tuition going up, but that ours is 5% more every year and is already the highest

Arti – agree – we should not see this as a provincial issue, and Mr Akbar's said that all governments are looking to see what they can do.

Alyssa – speak against the referendum question – The way you phrased the question was very loaded, the question does have the impact, are we going to go on strike also? Are we going to educate them that tuition has to go up because of inflation?

Trevor – against – stigma around the strike, greediness and violence, people causing trouble at these events, students not intending to cause violence they get caught in the fray. Like Natalie's friendly amendments. – Cover of education solutions – results from a province wide poll, the answers are around and pretty common sense. Education on issues around the strike, students are self-educated, we should focus on Ontario, and using Quebec as a launch pad on what to focus on, I think we should not focus on Quebec, we should start focus on Ontario tuition which is ridiculously high, with subsidies being really low

Shawn Steven – motion to divide the motion 2nd Scott

14- 0-1

Jordan – very dangerous to vote on this all together – this binds us to do a referendum, when we haven't gotten anywhere near the discussion on this

Mohammad Akbar – the problem is not that they are getting too much, it's that we aren't getting enough, or any. The money from one fighter jet, they (the government) could pay for tuition for 7 years. Quebec pays highest taxes, students pay taxes, they work the hardest, to get free education in Quebec, would be 1% of the budget not doing it not because it's not politically

possible, it is because they feel it will show they were wrong, and they will lose the election. 2500 hours, 45 of those the government said he would meet them, gave the students 1 hour, that's it. His solution, even from most conservative side, said that is was a political cop out. – student leaders took it back to students, students said no, because it was so political- students said go back there and get a better deal. This movement is directed by the students. Direct vote. The students are repressing the violent students. Students have been treated terribly by the government, the UN apposed the law. All I am asking is that we send a letter so they know we support them.

Trevor - It's hard to say we don't support anarchy, when the word anarchy is in name

Mohammad- That's not the meaning of the name

Trevor – this is a provincial issue, we should not support this until we find out what the students want. We need a poll or ref to show 51% of students support this support of Quebec .

Alyssa – call these motions to question – can't do all – 1st one then – 13-0-2 motion to vote passes

Vote on first motion – 11-4-1 – motion passes

Shawn Steve – friend amendment – so that it's not about the strike, it's about the things going on that caused it, tuition increases in general, government subsidies, current issues, and inflation

Mohammad Akbar- explains what friendly amendments mean - friendly amendments

2 BIRT the UWSA task the VPUA with performing the following measures in regards to the strike:

Educate students on the issues of tuition increases in general, government subsidies, current issues, AND INFLATION.

Develop materials on our tuition fees and the aforementioned issues

Use Facebook, Twitter and other social media to educate students on the aforementioned issues advocate for lower tuition fees

BIFRT the UWSA request materials on the aforementioned issues from the Canadian Federation of Students and the Ontario Undergraduate Student Alliance

Call 2nd into question – 16- 0-1 – passed

3rd motion into question – Mohammad Akbar – this aids me in making policies, give the council a stance. This is vague so we have a lot to work with on this

Eric – as chair I want to put a time restriction of 10 min on this

Shawn Steve – this might be too far away and be useless; Quebec might not be on strike anymore can we defer it?

Mohammad Akbar – you can vote it down or table it

Mohamed Almoayad- possibly getting different societies to poll their students, each department focuses on their students, to find out the information. I don't think referendum is effective because students won't vote.

Natalie – if we pass this, this has to happen? There isn't really a point to pass this, committing to a referendum might not be necessary.

Jordan – This might bind us to something we aren't sure we want to do, because there is no time limit, there is no reason to do it now.

Omar Z – research needs to be done first .

Alyssa – if we ask students if they want to pay less and get more. We know students will say yes. What are we trying to accomplish with this, a strike?

Scott – favor – we have no position – we need to find out what the students want us to do, what areas the students want us to go for. We need to know HOW they want us to do it, not just that they want us to do it.
